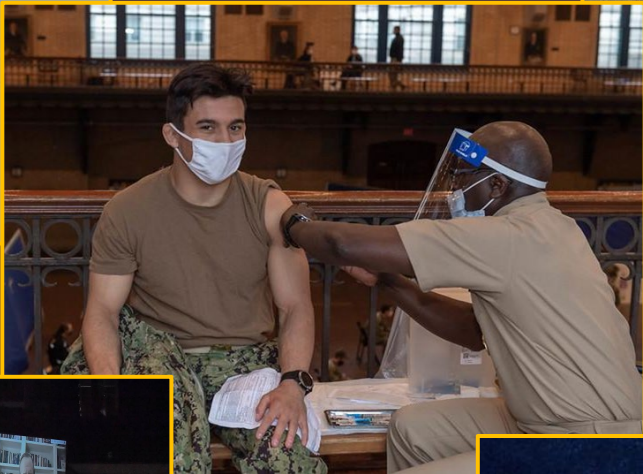
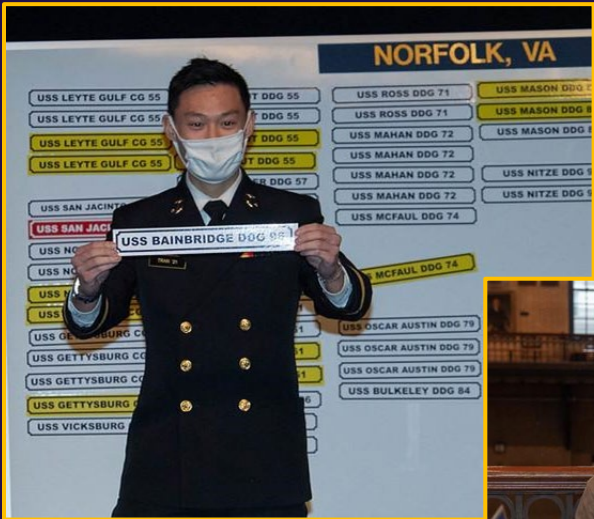

Spring Semester Update

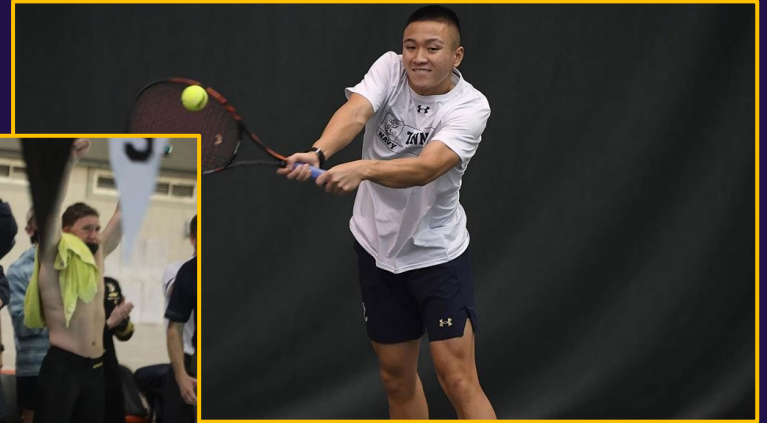
- Brigade reformed after extended Winter Leave period

- Over \$530M raised

Academic Excellence - Cyber

Called to Serve, Daring to Lead campaign enabled:

- Vastly accelerated development - concept to fully accredited major
- 4 renowned Distinguished Visiting Professors put USNA on Cyber map!
- Won 4 of last 6 NSA Cyber Exercises
- NSA designated Center of Academic Excellence in Cyber Ops
- Cyber savvy junior officers for the Fleet...every midn impacted

Academic Excellence

Called to Serve, Daring to Lead campaign enabled:

- Center for Academic Excellence
 - Increased capacity/access from 22,000 to 50,000 midn visits per year
 - Drove down academic attrition from over 3% to less than 1.2%
- International Programs: 2600 midn, including 600+ semester abroad
- Project Based Learning
 - Increased complexity and inter-disciplinary approach
 - Expanded capstone projects to thousands

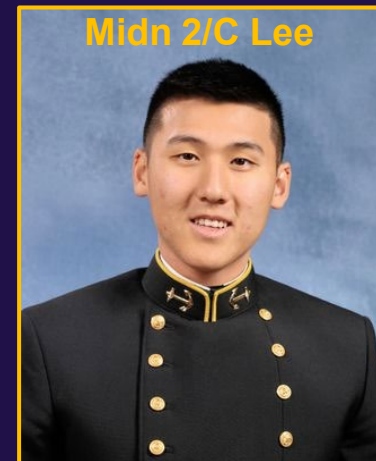

Leadership Excellence

Called to Serve, Daring to Lead campaign enabled:

- Stockdale Center for Ethical Leadership
- Significant expansion of the Stockdale Center's programs
 - Expanded research efforts with 27 one-year fellows over past 9 years
 - Developed the *Influence the Influencer* program to help develop the primary influencers of the Brigade...lauded by faculty/staff/coaches
 - Developed the *Boeing Leadership Innovation Laboratory*...from smart device accessible, augmented-reality to podcasts, highly successful w/Brigade



Athletic Excellence - Facilities



Athletic Excellence

Called to Serve, Daring to Lead campaign enabled:

- Recruitment and retention outstanding coaches & role models
- Enhanced student-athlete experience for 33 varsity & 16 club sports
- Exceptional performance and results during the campaign
 - Overall Army-Navy Star record of 115-79-5, overall series win in 8 of 9 years
 - 6 of 7 Patriot League Presidents' Cups
 - 107 Conference Championships
 - 119 All Americans and 77 Academic All Americans
 - 110 National or Conference Coaches of the Year
 - 91% graduation rate



Admissions Excellence

Called to Serve, Daring to Lead campaign enabled:

- Exceptional branding...morally, mentally and physically
- Expanded Admissions Outreach
- The most qualified and diverse incoming classes in USNA history
 - Increased fully qualified candidates from less than 2,000 to over 3,000/yr
 - Brigade female representation rose from 19.6% to 28.3%
 - Brigade minority representation increased from 32.0% to 37.1%
 - NAPSter graduation rate at USNA increased from 77% to 85%
