In 1873, ten Naval officers and five Marine officers founded the U.S. Naval Institute on the grounds of the U.S. Naval Academy. The economy was bad. The Navy was falling behind technologically and tactically. Ideas weren't moving up the chain of command. Our Navy and Marine Corps needed a non-partisan, independent, open forum. This was true in 1873 and it is true today.

HISTORIC PARTNERSHIP: THE U.S. NAVAL INSTITUTE AND THE U. S. NAVAL ACADEMY

1884 – Academy Superintendent grants Naval Institute permanent use of USNA facilities

1938 – NAAA and Naval Institute jointly fund construction of Preble Hall; recognized by **Act of Congress**

1939 – Naval Institute moves its offices to Preble Hall

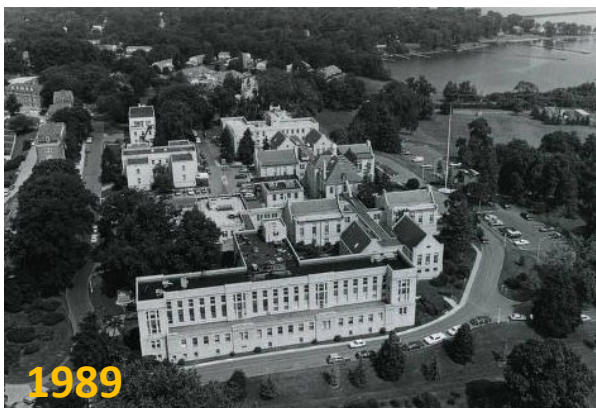
1962 – Naval Institute fully funds Preble Hall expansion

1987 – Naval Institute provides \$3,000,000 letter of credit to support construction of Alumni Hall



BEACH HALL and THE JACK C. TAYLOR CONFERENCE CENTER

- 1989 – Department of the Navy recognizes financial contributions of Naval Institute to USNA; authorizes 100-year lease of Bldg. 291
- 1998 – Remodel of Bldg. 291 begins, funded by Naval Institute and USNA
- 1999 – Remodel complete, building named in honor of Edward “Ned” Beach, Jr., retired Navy submarine officer and prolific author
- 2019 – Construction of the Jack C. Taylor Conference Center and renovation of Beach Hall begins
- 2021 – Jack C. Taylor Conference Center complete, building named for Jack C. Taylor, WWII Navy Aviator and founder of Enterprise Rental Car

Class Gifts / Giving

- Since graduation, the class of 1973 has donated over \$9.0 million to various causes around the Yard.
- 49% of the class made a donation in 2022, which ranks them in 1st place in participation with the decade of the 70's.
- Over 73% of the class participated in the 50th Gift Campaign, the highest percent participation of any class!
